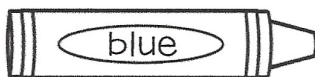

## Iditarod

"3, 2, 1... MUSH!" This is how the Iditarod starts. The Iditarod is a long sled dog race held every year in Alaska. Musher, or the humans, stand on a sled pulled by a team of dogs. Each team begins the 1049-mile race in Anchorage with sixteen dogs, but may end the race in Nome with as few as six dogs if the dogs become injured or sick. Each year, over fifty mushers and about 1,000 dogs race.

The Iditarod began in 1973 to test if the best sled dog teams can mush for a long time, even through snowstorms, strong winds, and very cold weather. The fastest anyone has finished the Iditarod is in 8 days, 19 hours, 46 minutes, and 39 seconds, but some teams take up to two weeks to finish the race.

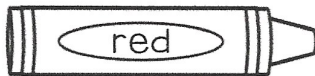
Dog mushing is important in Alaska because they can still travel in harsh weather. In 1925, many people in the city of Nome got sick with a deadly disease. Airplanes, cars, and trains couldn't take medicine all the way to Nome in the snow, so a relay of twenty dog-mushing teams brought it to the city. They saved many lives. The Iditarod is a hard race, but teams who finish feel very proud.



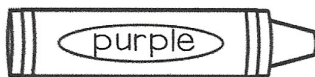

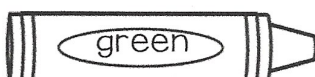

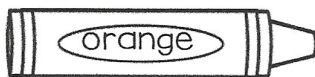
